Twenty-five years ago, when Carl was about eighteen years old, he asked me how he would know when he had truly fallen in love. How would he know that it wasn't simply infatuation or passion and that she was the right person? Today, Carl tells me that I said something to him about recognizing that if you have to ask the question, it probably isn't love; it is probably the woman who best captures the most attractive aspects of all the women he has ever dated, liked, or loved.

For the next twenty years or so, Carl never seemed to find that love he was seeking—until one day, it happened. He fell in love and got married. Five years later, I asked Carl if it was indeed love. He said he believed it was, even though during those years of empty seeking, he thought true love would never come to him. He also said he's convinced that it was the hand of God that brought them together. Of that, he has no doubts.

In its own way, Carl's story is really the story of Peter and his friends going fishing and finding nothing all night long. Then, at dawn, a voice from the shore suggests that they try the other side of the boat. Lo and behold, an abundance appears where there had been only emptiness. That's when Peter and his friends realize, "It is the Lord!" For us, too, we have those moments when we recognize God's hand in our lives. •

Beginning this week on May 7, the Conclave in Rome will open to choose the next Pope after the passing of Pope Francis two weeks ago. The 135 Cardinal Electors of the College of Cardinals hail from 71 different countries across the five continents. Of those cardinals, 108 were appointed by Pope Francis, while 22 were created by Benedict XVI, and five by St. John Paul II.

During his 12 years of pontificate, Pope Francis significantly reshaped the College of Cardinals, making it a less Eurocentric and a more international body. For the first time, 15 nations will be represented by their native Cardinal electors. Those nations are: Haiti, Cape Verde, Central African Republic, Papua New Guinea, Myanmar, Rwanda, Tonga, Malaysia, Sweden, Luxembourg, Timor Leste, Singapore, Paraguay, South Sudan, and Serbia.

There are 53 cardinals from Europe, 16 from North America, 4 from Central America and 17 from South America; 23 from Asia, 18 from Africa, and 4 from Oceania.

Thus, while the European Cardinals still represent the majority of those who will gather in he Conclave, the "rest of the world" now clearly surpasses Europe, with the Americas as a whole significantly increasing its "weight." (from the <u>Vatican</u> News).
